Shumka presents dance-theatre touring productions, as well as intimate concert repertoire across the country and around the world. Seen by millions on international television broadcasts, the company has presented command performances for Queens, Prime Ministers, and Presidents, and have performed alongside the likes of Andrea Bocelli and Julie Andrews. Along with Alberta Ballet and Edmonton Opera, Shumka is honoured to be a resident company of the Northern Alberta Jubilee Auditorium.

Sixty years of performance history has shaped Shumka's signature music and dance style. While maintaining deep respect for their heritage, Shumka continually challenges conventional boundaries to define the experience of Ukrainian dance in the context of today's society.

MISSION


Shumka promotes, develops and preserves professional Canadian-Ukrainian dance as community leaders.

Executive Director's Message

ecently, we have been working on a film project that celebrates 130 years since the first Ukrainian immigrants came to Canada. These pioneers worked hard amid many unknowns in this new promised land. They wouldn't let the harsh seasonal elements limit them, or years of difficult physical labour break them. They continued to thrive together with the collective work of the community supporting the whole. It was a true sense of bravery and ambition. Of courage and hope.

This is exactly how I feel about the 2020-21 operational year. As we faced lock-downs, postponements, pivots, and cancellations, we also looked at the positives: new ways of doing things, the importance of supporting one another in difficult times, using digital mediums to spread our art form further than ever before. There were many cloudy days, but when the sun came out, we took full advantage of it. We depended on government and community foundation subsidies, started relationships with new supporters in the corporate world, and continued to build stronger bonds with our growing donor base. This year was one of bravery and ambition in the Shumka Family. From dancers and artistic leaders to instructors and students, from staff and management to supporters and donors. As the world continues to change around us, we too will change with it, with a continued mission of pride, development, and promotion of our heritage through dance.

That is the the first word that I think of when reflecting on the last year. With the obvious challenges that the world has presented all of us, this organization continues to work, create and thrive. While not having our traditional avenues to share our art we have looked increasingly to a virtual and online presence to share and create. This has included films and discussions of new work and old as well as continuing to offer classes, training and development of creative work over Zoom.

This summer alone we have created and produced two films. The first being *Kobzari Kozachok*. This was a collaboration with the Ukrainian Bandurist Chorus and utilized their membership being spread across North America. In the film we had singers from San Diego, Edmonton, Manitoba, Toronto, Windsor, Niagara Falls, Cleveland, and New York City. As for Shumka, we represented our beautiful city of Edmonton and surrounding area. The film cuts together all of these locations with beautiful choreography by Paul Oljinyk and Laura Stachniak.

Our second film, titled *A Promised Land*, is a beautiful tribute to the 130 Years of Ukrainian Immigration to Canada. Shot on location at the Ukrainian Cultural Village, this film recognizes the struggle of our ancestors and celebrates their contributions made to the cultural identity of Canada. We are very excited to premiere this film as part of our *Shumka on Tour* celebrations in the spring of 2022.

While this work has been wonderful, we all know that the stage is where Shumka belongs. We are now working on our return to the stage this Christmas with Shumka's *Nutcracker*. Once again joining forces with the National Ballet of Ukraine and Virsky Ensemble, this will be as exciting for our company as it will be for the audience. With performances in Camrose and Edmonton we continue to be part of the Christmas season in Alberta. Following soon after in April, we begin our national tour of *Mosquito's Wedding* and *Echoes of Hopak*. *Shumka on Tour* will be the first national tour for many years, and we are excited to re-connect with our audiences across the country.

Over the last 60 years Shumka has grown to be a cultural mainstay in the Canadian dance scene. Despite the challenges that we have all encountered over the last 18 months the ongoing work of the administration and the dancers will ensure that Shumka will continue to thrive for many years to come.








